(capped)

Voss made a motion to approve
his proposal of a cash payout start-
ing at age 58. The motion failed for
lack of a second.

A motion was made by Forrest,
to approve his early retirement pro-
posal, starting at age 55, seconded
by Taukei. Roll call vote. Forrest
