Residential Rate. The schedule for the collection of residential solid waste will be held citywide on each Wednesday. 2. Commercial Rate. Rates for

commercial establishments shall be established by the City Council Each commercial account shall pay the rate as established above per month for said service, which shall be charged as part of and in addition to their water bill and sewer rental bill and shall be paid each month upon receipt of the water bill and at the same time as the water and sewer rental bill is paid. Any business or commercial establishment may request that the monthly sanitation fee be waived upon proof of ownership of a city specified sol-id waste container.

shall be \$30.00 per discharge. All requests for container discharges must be made to the City Clerk's office. Residential Rental properties with more than four (4) units may purchase a container / dumpster to be used by the tenants. Multiple dwellings shall be charged the current rate as established above per unit. The containers will be discharged on a regular basis on Tuesdays and/or Fridays as scheduled with the owner.

4. City-Owned Containers / Dumpsters. Delivery and return of containers will be on Tuesdays and Fridays. No deliver-ies or discharges will be made on container will be \$35.00. All water consumers outside the city limits shall pay \$52.50 for each discharge of a container.

Containers will be allowed to remain at the same site one week, if demand allows it. If a container is delivered on a Tuesday and is kept until the following Tuesday and then discharged, \$35.00 or \$52.50 will be charged to the appropriate account. Any additional discharges would result in a charge of \$35.00 or \$52.50.

All sewer consumer users shall pay according to the following rates:

July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025 Rate: The minimum charge per month shall be billed at \$29.57. In addition, each user shall pay a user charge rate for operation, maintenance and replacement of \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered for each user within the sewer dis-

trict created, and \$44.36 minimum. plus \$9.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered, for each user outside of the sewer district.

July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026 Rate: The minimum charge per month shall be billed at \$31.05. In addition, each user shall pay a user charge rate for operation, maintenance and replacement of \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered for each user within the sewer district created and \$46.58 minimum plus \$9.00 per 1.000 gallons of water metered, for each user outside of the sewer district.

July 1, 2026 - June 30, 2027 Rate: The minimum charge per month shall be billed at \$32.60. In addition, each user shall pay a user charge rate for operation, maintenance and replacement of \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered for each user within the sewer district created, and \$48.91 minimum. plus \$9.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered, for each user outside of the sewer district.

July 1, 2027 - June 30, 2028 Rate: The minimum charge per month shall be billed at \$34.23. In addition, each user shall pay a user charge rate for operation, maintenance and replacement of \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered for each user within the sewer district created, and \$51.36 minimum. plus \$9.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered, for each user outside of the sewer district.

July 1, 2028 – June 30, 2029 Rate: The minimum charge per month shall be billed at \$35.94. In addition, each user shall pay a user charge rate for operation, maintenance and replacement of \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered for each user within the sewer district created, and \$53.93 minimum, plus \$9.00 per 1,000 gallons of water metered, for each user outside of the sewer district.

For all commercial users, user charges shall be based on water used during the current month. If a commercial or industrial user has a consumptive use of water, or in some other manner uses water which is not returned to the wastewater collection system, the user charge for the user may be based on a wastewater meter(s) or separate water meter(s) installed and maintained at the contributor's expense, and in a manner acceptable to the City.

3. The rent shall be paid with the water bill at the time the payment of the water bill is due, and under the same conditions, beginning with the next payment after an enactment of the Ordinance or if connection has not been made, after connection to the sewer system is made

4. Where, in the judgment of the City Council, special conditions exist that would make the application of the basic sewer rental inequitable or unfair to either the City or the

sewer user, a special rate may be established by the City. Such rates shall be subject to approval by resolution of the City Council.

Special rates shall be established in the same way for all sewer users under like situations and shall take into account the quantity of wastewater and its strength, and the City's discharge permit limitations. Whenever sewer users desire special rates they shall at their own expense supply the information reguired by the Council to establish special rates. Whenever the City desires to establish special rates the sewer user shall cooperate with the City in obtaining the necessary information at the expense of the City.

5. The basic user charge rates established in the Ordinance shall apply to all who have available the City's wastewater treatment system. Because of the requirements for debt service, reserve, and replacement funds, in the event the water is turned off at the curbstop, or the water meter pulled to prevent water usage, the minimum basic sewer rate is payable.

6. The amount of rent charged shall constitute a lien upon that property served by the sewer system, and that amount shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes if payment is not made when due. Water and sewage services to the property for which rent has not been paid may be suspended until that payment is made. 7. All users shall be billed monthly. Billings for any particular month shall be made within seven days after the end of that month. Payments are due when the billings are made. Any payment not re-ceived within fifteen days after the billing is made shall be delinquent. Failure to pay sewer rental within fifteen days after date of the statement, shall incur penalty at the rate of ten percent (10%), and is subject to a disconnection of water after the second unpaid billing and notice issued by the City. 8. The City Council Finance Com-

mittee shall review the rates being charged annually to ensure ade quacy, proportionality and appropriate distribution of operation, maintenance and replacement funds.

9. All parties understand that the user charge system takes precedence over any terms or conditions of agreements or contracts between the City of Sigourney and the users.

10. There shall be a surcharge established to ensure adequacy of funds to meet requirements of the sewer department. That surcharge shall be \$3.25 per month for each user and \$4.88 per month for each user outside the city limits. This surcharge shall be reviewed annually at the same time rates are reviewed. Surcharge shall be designated as a repair fund dedicated

July $\overline{1}$, 2025 – June 30, 2026: The first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$24.95 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$6.00 per 1000 gallons. July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027: The

first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$26.20 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$6.00 per 1000 gallons.

July 1, 2027 – June 30, 2028: The first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$27.51 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$6.00 per 1000 gallons.

July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026: The first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$37.42 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$9.00 per 1000 gallons.

July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027: The

first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$39.29 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$9.00 per

1000 gallons. July 1, 2027 – June 30, 2028: The first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$41.25 (minimum charge). Any amount exceeding the first 1,000 gallons will be billed at \$9.00 per 1000 gallons.

6-5-12 WATERMAIN REPLACE-MENT SURCHARGE
