4-1-1 DEFINITIONS  
For use in this chapter the following terms are defined as follows:  
1. The term "dogs" shall mean animals of the canine species whether altered or not.  
2. The term "at large" shall mean any licensed or unlicensed animal found off the premises of the owner and not under the control of a competent person, restrained within a motor vehicle, housed in a veterinary hospital or kennel, on a leash or "at heel" beside a competent person and obedient to that person's command.  
3. The term "owner" shall mean any person owning, keeping, sheltering or harboring an animal.  
4-1-2 IMMUNIZATION  
Every owner of a dog shall obtain a rabies vaccination for such animal. It is unlawful for any person to own or have a dog in the person's possession, six months of age or over, which has not been vaccinated against rabies. Dogs kept in kennels and not allowed to run at large are not subject to these vaccination requirements.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 351.33)  
4-1-3 AT LARGE PROHIBITED  
No owner or person having custody of an animal shall permit such animal to run at large.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 351.41)  
4-1-4 ANIMAL NUISANCES  
It shall be unlawful for any person to permit an animal under such person's control or within such

person's custody to commit a nuisance. An animal shall be considered a nuisance if it:  
1. Damages, soils, defiles or defecates on private property other than the owner's or on public walks and recreation areas unless such waste is immediately removed and properly disposed of by the owner.  
2. Causes unsanitary, dangerous or offensive conditions.  
3. Causes a disturbance by excessive barking or other noise making or chases vehicles, or molests, attacks or interferes with persons or other domestic animals.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 657.1)  
4-1-5 DANGEROUS ANIMALS  
1. Dangerous Animals Prohibited. No person shall keep, shelter, or harbor for any purpose within the City limits, a dangerous animal.  
2. Definitions. A dangerous animal is:  
a. Any animal which is not naturally tame or gentle, and which is of a wild nature or disposition, and which is capable of killing, inflicting serious injury upon, or causing disease among human beings or domestic animals, and having known tendencies as a species to do so.  
b. The following are animals which shall be deemed to be dangerous animals per se:  
(1) Lions, tigers, jaguars, leopards, cougars, lynx, and bobcats;  
(2) Wolves, coyotes, and foxes;  
(3) Badgers, wolverines, weasels, skunks, and mink;  
(4) Raccoons;  
(5) Bears;  
(6) Monkeys, chimpanzees, and apes;  
(7) Alligators and crocodiles;  
(8) Scorpions and gila monsters;  
(9) Snakes that are venomous or constrictors;  
(10) Pit bulls meaning any dog that is an American Pit Bull Terrier, American Staffordshire Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier, or any dog displaying the majority of physical traits of any one or more of the above breeds (more so than any other breed), or any dog exhibiting those distinguishing characteristics which substantially conform to the standards established by the American Kennel Club or United Kennel Club for any of the

above breeds.  
(11) Rotweilers;  
c. Any animals declared to be dangerous by the City Council.  
3. Dangerous Animals Exceptions. The keeping of dangerous animals shall not be prohibited in the following circumstances:  
a. The keeping of dangerous animals in a public zoo, bona fide educational or medical institution, humane society, or museum where they are kept as live specimens for the public to view, or for the purpose of instruction, research or study, and has obtained the written approval of the City Council.  
4-1-6 KEEPING A VICIOUS ANIMAL  
An animal is deemed to be vicious when it has attacked, injured, or bitten any person without provocation or has exhibited the propensity to attack, injure, or bite persons or other domesticated animals, unprovoked, and such propensity is known to the owner or to reasonably have been known to the owner thereof.  
A. An animal is deemed vicious under the following circumstances:  
1. Has bitten or clawed a person without provocation on two separate occasions within a twelve (12) month period.  
2. Did bite or claw a person, without provocation, causing injuries above the shoulders of a person.  
3. Has attacked any domestic animal, without provocation, on more than two (2) separate occasions during the life of the animal.  
4. Has killed any domestic animal, without provocation, while off the property of the attacking animal's owner.  
5. Has bitten another animal or human, without provocation, that causes a fracture, skin puncture, laceration, cut, or injury to the other animal or human.  
4-1-7 KENNEL DOGS  
Kennel dogs which are kept or raised solely for the bona fide purpose of sale and which are kept under constant restraint are not subject to the provisions of this ordinance.  
4-1-8 ANIMAL ABUSE  
A person is guilty of animal abuse if the person intentionally injures,

maims, disfigures, or destroys an animal owned by another person, in any manner, including intentionally poisoning the animal. A person guilty of animal abuse is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor. This section shall not apply to any of the following:  
1. A person acting with the consent of the person owning the animal, unless the action constitutes animal neglect as provided in section 717B.3.  
2. A person acting to carry out an order issued by a court.  
3. A licensed veterinarian practicing veterinary medicine as provided in chapter 169.  
4. A person acting in order to carry out another provision of law which allows the conduct.  
5. A person taking, hunting, trapping, or fishing for a wild animal as provided in chapter 481A.  
6. A person acting to protect the person's property from a wild animal as defined in section 481A.1.  
7. A person acting to protect a person from injury or death caused by a wild animal as defined in section 481A.1.  
8. A person reasonably acting to protect the person's property from damage caused by an unconfined animal.  
9. A person reasonably acting to protect a person from injury or death caused by an unconfined animal.  
10. A local authority reasonably acting to destroy an animal, if at the time of the destruction, the owner of the animal is absent or unable to care for the animal, and the animal is permanently distressed by disease or injury to a degree that would result in severe and prolonged suffering.  
11. An institution, as defined in section 145B.1, or a research facility, as defined in section 162.2, provided that the institution or research facility performs functions within the scope of accepted practices and disciplines associated with the institution or research facility.  
(Code of Iowa 717B.2)  
4-1-9 ANIMAL NEGLECT  
1. A person who impounds or confines, in any place, an animal is

guilty of animal neglect, if the person does any of the following: fails to supply the animal during confinement with a sufficient quantity of food or water; fails to provide a confined dog or cat with adequate shelter; or tortures, deprives of necessary sustenance, mutilates, beats, or kills an animal by any means which causes unjustified pain, distress, or suffering.  
2. This section does not apply to an institution, as defined in section 145B.1, or a research facility, as defined in section 162.2, provided that the institution or research facility performs functions within the scope of accepted practices and disciplines associated with the institution or research facility.  
3. A person who negligently or intentionally commits the offense of animal neglect is guilty of a simple misdemeanor. A person who intentionally commits the offense of animal abuse which results in serious injury to or the death of an animal is guilty of a serious misdemeanor.  
(Code of Iowa, 717B.3)  
4-1-10 ABANDONMENT  
A person who has ownership or custody of a cat or dog shall not abandon the cat or dog, except the person may deliver the cat or dog to another person who will accept ownership and custody or the person may deliver the cat or dog to an animal shelter or pound as defined in section 162.2. A person who violates this section is guilty of a simple misdemeanor.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 717B.7)  
4-1-11 EXHIBITIONS AND FIGHTS  
No person shall arrange, promote, or stage an exhibition at which any animal is tormented, or any fight between animals or between a person and an animal, or shall keep a place where such exhibitions and fights are staged for the entertainment of spectators.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 717B.6)  
4-1-13 BOTHERSOME ANIMALS  
It is unlawful for a person to keep within the City bothersome animals such as bees, swine, sheep, goats, fowl and geese, which tend to disrupt the peace and good order of the community.

4-1-14 DAMAGE OR INTERFERENCE  
It is unlawful for the owner of an animal to allow or permit such animal to pass upon the premises of another thereby causing damage to, or interference with, the premises.  
4-1-15 ANNOYANCE OR DISTURBANCE  
It is unlawful for the owner of a dog to allow or permit such dog to cause serious annoyance or disturbance to any person or persons by frequent and habitual howling, yelping, barking, or otherwise; or, by running after or chasing persons, bicycles, automobiles or other vehicles.  
4-1-17 OWNERS DUTY  
3. It is the duty of the owner of any dog, cat or other animal which has bitten or attacked a person or any person having knowledge of such bite or attack to report this act to a local health or law enforcement official. It is the duty of physicians and veterinarians to report to the local board of health the existence of any animal known or suspected to be suffering from rabies.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 351.38)  
4-1-18 CONFINEMENT  
When a local board of health receives information that any person has been bitten by an animal or that a dog or animal is suspected of having rabies, it shall order the owner to confine such animal in the manner it directs. If the owner fails to confine such animal in the manner directed, and the animal shall be apprehended and impounded by such board, and after two weeks the board may humanely destroy the animal. If such animal is returned to its owner, the owner shall pay the cost of impoundment.  
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 351.39)  
4-1-19 SUMMONS ISSUED  
The owner of any licensed dog, or the owner if known of any unlicensed dog or other animal, shall be issued a summons to appear before a proper court to answer charges of permitting such dog or animal to be at large in violation of this chapter.
