Dave Welch, Sigourney Fire Chief, informed he is applying for a grant that requires Board of Supervisor formal approval and since the Community Outreach Center is a nonprofit organization they will have to apply for an abatement. Welch wanted his status noted that he is against joining City and County entities for law enforcement. Board consensus is they are not picking sides, rather look at it as helping out a neighbor and the city has yet to provide expectations to be considered. Bates discussed the following: polling location changes for the General Election and Dept. of Revenue 2021 estimated Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) monthly distribution amounts.
